I have noticed over the years that Lutherans don't do "change" very well. Move something in the sanctuary...why did you do that? Change something in the bulletin that we are used to...why did you do that? And heaven forbid! You decide to try a different wine for communion! Why did you do that!?

We find a certain comfort level in "knowing" what things will be like and how things are going to "go." The one difference I have noted is that as we "know" each other and build relationship and understanding with patience, the permutations of change seem to happen a little easier.

This came to mind because not only did OSLC have our Annual Meeting for the ministry of a new year, but great change is happening on the national/political level. It would seem that many people want to probe the negative before trying to see the positive. Honestly, I do not know how all the changes will distill out, but "having it out" with others does not seem to bring hope to the forefront.

With those thoughts in mind, regardless of any one person's political bent, a passage of scripture came to mind.

Galatians 5:22-25 "...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit."




