#### "Won't You Be My Neighbor"

Do you remember "Mr. Roger's Neighborhood?" Growing up, watched it and with my kids, watched it. Simple yet deep. Teaching us how to care for one another and how to be patient, kind and caring.

Fred Rogers took time in being a prophet for grace, love, understanding and forgiveness. The puppets and actors were not "state of the art," but the message timeless and we watched with smiles.

Mr. Roger's theme song, simple yet sticks in your mind. "It's a beautiful day in this neighborhood. A beautiful day for a neighbor. Would you be mine? Could you be mine?

I have always wanted to have a neighbor just like you. I've always wanted to live in a neighborhood with you. So let's make the most of this beautiful day. Would you be mine? Could you be mine?

We had two funerals this past week...Jolaine Scoville and Phil Dralle. People came because in so many ways they felt the touch of being a neighbor to Jolaine, Phil and their families. It was love in grief but shared

in caring. "Would you be mine? Could you be mine? Yes, they all said! Stories told and memories shared. Faith was the bedrock of salvation being proclaimed on those days.

Let's not wait as we commend people to God's Kingdom. This summer think of those people that we can show and love and tell of our love.

It reminds me of the parable of "the Good Samaritan" from Luke 10:25-37.

An abbreviated section of scripture:

<sup>25</sup> And behold, a lawyer stood up to put him to the test, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

<sup>26</sup> He said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read?"

<sup>27</sup> And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

<sup>28</sup> And he said to him, "You have answered right; do this, and you will live."

<sup>29</sup> But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

If we have to "justify ourselves," then we have lost Mr. Rogers and Jesus! The text tells the story of the Good Samaritan who takes care of the beaten man, whatever it took. Then

two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.' <sup>36</sup> Which of these three, do you think, proved neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?"

The said, "The one who showed mercy

on him." And Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Go and do likewise, says Jesus.

Have a great and restful summer and consider ways that you can and could be "neighborly." "Would you be mine? Could you be Mine? Won't you be my neighbor?" Or as scripture says: love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all you mind; and your neighbor as yourself.

We are neighbors and community together! I look forward to seeing you every week. I also look forward to the fall when our ministry grows and moves forward. And being neighbors beyond Our Savior Lutheran!

Also surviving are two daughters, Anne (Joel) Lietz of Yorkville and Rebecca (Chris) Kuethe of Pekin; one son, Michael (Courtney) Dralle of Pekin; seven grandchildren, Jack, Julia, Jenna, Luke, Caroline, Ada and Lola; two brothers, John (Vera) Dralle, Jr. and Joseph (Ernesto) Dralle-Moreno and two sisters, Patricia Kendall and Rhonda Edging. #### Keep trying

In *The God Who Stays*, contemporary Christian musician Matthew West writes about the pandemic's fear-filled early days. After his concert tour was abruptly canceled in March 2020, he rode to an airport "feeling utterly hopeless about a world that was spinning out of control."

Then Arthur, his ride-share driver, began singing along to the radio — and the song happened to be West's "The God Who Stays." West joined in, jokingly asking how he sounded. "Not so good," Arthur replied, not knowing West's identity. "You keep trying."

The driver shared how those lyrics uplifted him during life's difficulties, and West later recalled that conversation during lockdown, while wondering where God was. The musician realized he had "settled for a socially distant relationship with the One who is nearer than I dare to believe, closer than the air I breathe." But West pictured "God running toward me with open arms like the prodigal's father," and he resolved to keep trying — and to grow closer to the God who always stays.
