Pastor's Letter

it is I who say to you, "Do not fear, I will help you." *Isaiah 41:13* What scares you or what are you afraid of?

Almost a silly question for neither you nor I, nor anyone, can say they have never been afraid or scared.

I remember those sweaty palms when waiting to take an essay test in seminary. Can I remember - will the questions be of something I studied or catch me scratching my head in panic. Recently COVID scared us all. Will wearing a mask suffice, will using disinfectant work and make sure we all keep our distance or stay home?

When I go to the doctor and he/she says....well, let's do some more tests. Or after the diagnosis, what is the best treatment for health and or further life. In thinking of your "life partner," are there better ways we could support or be of help or holding hands in comfort.

When I was younger than 10 and had learned to swim, my friends pestered me to climb the ladder of the high dive and jump! Oh, I did it, scared and all. If you ask me why today, I'm not sure I would have a good answer.

Are there directions, places that God in Christ might be calling you and you are saying..."are you sure?" We pray and often the answer, like Peter in the boat asking Jesus to bid him come ON the water. Jesus simply says: "come." Afraid, yes, for when he saw the winds and waves he began to sink. Notice it says, "immediately" Jesus reaches for him.

Then there are times when we would like to hide from God. Like Elijah in the cave on Mount Horeb or Jonah taking a ship to Tarshish to get away from the presence of God. Jonah 1:1-3

Jonah Tries to Run Away from God

1 Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah son of Amittai, saying, ² "Go at once to Nineveh, that great city, and cry out against it, for their wickedness has come up before me."³ But Jonah set out to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid his fare and went on board, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD.

Of course hiding in a cave like Elijah or boarding a ship like Jonah doesn't

take away the fear, it just means we are hiding.

Two things that keep coming to my heart and spirit:

•Jesus doesn't debate but immediately reaches for us even when we are sinking amid the waves of life.

•What we are afraid of can still be faced in peace when we realize we can't "hide" from God and as Isaiah says: "do not fear for I will help you."

Now, it may not seem clear as you crack the door open, wondering what might be next on a new day. Just realize you are never alone and God's help will come when you "reach out your hand" whether in prayer or the presence of God in someone else near to you.

Summer is ending and Fall beginning, just remember you are never alone and Jesus' hand reaches for you no matter what stage of life or direction you are to go. You are part of God's heart in Christ!

Who, me? Yes, you!

The Bible is filled with people who don't feel up to the challenge of serving God, speaking for God or leading his people. But God always knows what he's doing. Pastor Haviland Houston issues this challenge: "When you are hesitant to act, or feel a failure of nerve coming on, when courage lags, or even if laziness and the 'I don't care' blues get you down, may the words of Mordecai to Esther burn in your hearts and minds: 'And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"" (See Esther 4:14.)

Max Lucado offers a similar reminder in You Were Made for This Moment. "God always has his person," he writes, also citing the book of Esther. "When we feel as though everything is falling apart, God is working in our midst, causing everything to fall into place. He is the King of quiet providence, and he invites you and me to partner with him in his work."

Lucado continues: "[God] has a Joseph for every famine and a David for every Goliath. When his people need rescuing, God calls a Rahab into service. When a baby Moses needs a mama, God prompts an Egyptian princess to have compassion. He always has his person. He had someone in the story of Esther. And in your story he has you."

SEPTEMBER FLOWER CHART



the area. He will be a great addition along with our Lead Organist, Lillian Pinkston, and our 4th/5th Sunday organist, Jill Rimington.


