Sharing of the Peace

P: May the peace of our Lord be with you always!

C: And also with you.

Invocation and Call to Worship

P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

L: We live in a world where peace can be hard to find. We are surrounded by strife and quarrels. We are often filled with worry and fear. Jesus tells us, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27)

C: Jesus our Savior, when we are troubled and worried by the strife around us, grant us your peace.

It is peace that Jesus won for us through his death on the cross and his triumphant resurrection. It is peace that we can share with others as we tell them of Jesus' love.

Instead, we listen to the temptations of the world around us, and we are often the cause of strife. We live according to our own selfish desires. Have mercy on us, and forgive us. Lead us each day to follow our Savior.

P: God has had mercy on us. He sent his Son Jesus, the Prince of Peace, to suffer and die for our sins to bring us peace with God and with one another. By the power and promise of God's peace in Christ, your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.
